JUMP TO IT: The Stonehenge bouncy castle will be part of Whitstable Biennale **EVENT**

Monument to having fun

THE seaside town of Whitstable has a host of attractions to help it pull in the crowds.

But next month it gets perhaps its strangest yet – an inflatable version of Stonehenge.

Sacrilege is a life-size inflatable replica of the Wiltshire monument, created by Turner Prize-winning artist Jeremy Deller, which also doubles up as a bouncy castle.

It has been entertaining thousands during the London Festival as part of the Olympic celebrations in Hyde Park. But it will be heading to the the north Kent town as part of the Whitstable

Biennale on September 5.

Mr Deller said: "A lot of my work deals with history, and Sacrilege is no exception; this is a way to get reacquainted with ancient Britain with your shoes off."

With the backing of the Arts Council, the bouncy artwork will then head off around the UK appearing at 30 different festivals and locations.

Sue Jones, director of the Whitstable Biennale 2012, said: "Jeremy Deller is one of the UK's most important artists and Whitstable Biennale is delighted that Sacrilege is coming here."
